Investigation of the Effectiveness of Brief Intervention on Harmful Cannabis Use in Teenagers and Young Adults: A randomized controlled clinical trial

Protocol summary

Study aim

This study aims to reduce the harmful use of cannabis among teenagers and young people, while also increasing their motivation to quit using it.

Design

The clinical trial has an intervention and control group, a blinded, randomized, sample size of 48. The block randomization method was used for randomization

Settings and conduct

This research examines the effectiveness of a brief intervention on the harmful use of cannabis in teenagers and young adults who refer to Rasht Healing Hospital. The study begins by taking the ASSIST questionnaire from the eligible, and thus, those who are in the medium risk group in terms of cannabis use and who meet the other conditions to enter the intervention are included in the study. The samples are randomly divided into two control and intervention groups. Both groups are first asked to fill out a questionnaire to determine the amount of cannabis consumption and their desire and motivation to quit. After performing conventional treatment on both groups, the experimental group was subjected to a brief intervention by the researcher and the ASSIST was taken from both groups again.

Intervention groups

A brief intervention is designed based on the principles of motivational interviewing or motivational enhancement therapy, and the responsibility for change is placed on the patient. The control group is subjected to the usual treatment of cannabis use disorders, which is

Randomization description

Patients are divided into two groups: intervention and control. This division is done using the block randomization method, containing 12 blocks and a block size of 4. The methodologies used to determine block randomization using the online software <http://www.sealedenvelope.com> are as follows: The sequence is BBAA, BABA, BBAA, BBAA, AABB, ABBA, BBAA, ABBA, BBAA, ABBA, ABBA, BBAA. Random allocation is performed by a psychiatric resident (researcher) using a sealed envelope.

Blinding (investigator's opinion)

Blinding description

For blinding, for the final evaluation, self-reported questionnaires are used by the patients so that the researcher does not influence the research results. Also, a person different from the psychiatry resident who performed the interventions will perform the final evaluation.

Description

Intervention group: First, the common treatment method for cannabis use disorders, which is a psycho educational interview, is performed for the intervention group or experiment, and then they are treated with a brief intervention method (short-term intervention). Brief intervention is done to identify current or potential drug use problems and motivate people at risk to change drug use behavior. Brief interventions in primary care can be from 5 minutes of brief advice to 15 to 30 minutes of brief counseling. The components of brief intervention are: 1- Feedback (Feedback) 2- Responsibility (Responsibility) 3- Advice (Advice) 4- Change options menu (Menu of alternative change options) 5- Empathy 6- Self-efficacy
